

Spring and/or Summer 2024 Internship: Help Build Arclet and Transform Public Health Communications

What is Arclet?

Public health communication that is engaging, evidence-based, culturally competent, and delivered by trusted local messengers is critical for promoting health behaviors that can improve health. Yet health communicators - the people tasked with getting credible health information to their communities - lack the essential tools they need to consistently deliver high-quality information, measure impact, and engage effectively.

Arclet is an easy-to-use platform that allows health communicators to locate, localize, test, share, and measure engaging, evidence-based, and culturally competent health information in their communities.

Key features of the platform include:

- A database of aggregated existing health campaigns (on a range of topics) from credible sources;
- Design customization so that communicators can tailor and localize information so it is clearly coming from a trusted local messenger;
- Message testing to ensure that it will have the intended impact with the target audience;
- Support for strategic & targeted online dissemination to reach intended audiences where they are already receiving information; and
- Data analysis and sharing to provide information on what works, what doesn't work, and what would work to do better.

Internship Description:

This is an exciting opportunity to play a meaningful role in a social impact health tech startup at its earliest stages! This internship will involve working closely with Arclet's founder, Adrienne Ammerman, to improve on the prototype of the Arclet platform and roll it out to public health communicators across North Carolina and the U.S.

The scope of work may include:

- 1. Expand & improve the database of existing evidence-based health communications materials available in the Arclet platform, with an emphasis on culturally relevant materials
- Help collect and synthesize early user feedback (from WNC Health Communicators Collaborative members and public health communicators in North Carolina) to communicate back with tech partners as we iterate the platform
- 3. Engage in research & conversations about generative AI and public health communications
- 4. Assist with grant writing

Internship Details:

- 5-10 hours per week
- Position may be fully remote, or hybrid (Arclet is based in Asheville, NC)
- This internship is currently unpaid, but opportunities for a stipend may be discussed.

Position Requirements:

A strong interest in public health communications, creating equitable access to high quality health information in every community, and social impact startups. Curiosity, passion, willingness to learn, and ability to think outside of the box are all welcome traits.
